LOS ANGELES (June 1, 2005) — AECOM, the global design and management company, added businesswoman, experienced independent director, and community leader Linda Griego as an independent member of its Board of Directors. Ms. Griego currently serves on the advisory board of directors of US Bank and recently concluded a six-year term as a Los Angeles director of the Federal Reserve Bank of San Francisco. She also currently serves on the boards of Granite Construction Inc. and the Southwest Water Company as well as a trustee of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.
